UTILITY BILLING

Reading Water Meters

All 5,000 plus water meters in Portland are read every month. Meters that are in clear view and easy to locate can reduce costs of having to conduct re-reads. You can assist City water meter readers and the Utility Billing Department to be more efficient by practicing the following actions:

- * Keep all items such as trash canisters, potted plants, vehicles and debris off the meter box
- * Keep shrubbery and other landscaping from obstructing clear and easy access to the meter box. Meter readers are unable to read meters if tree limbs are placed on the meters.

Your efforts in this area are much appreciated by the meter readers and maintenance personnel, and may be appreciated by you when quick access to the shut-off valve is necessary. Meters are normally read between the hours of 7:30 AM and 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. City meter readers are identified by wearing shirts with the City logo on them.

Utility Deposit Increase

The City requires new customers to post a deposit when opening a utility account. The utility security deposit rate has increased for some categories. The table to the left shows the new rates in effect as of October 21, 2015.

Nonsufficient Funds Fee Increase

The City has increased the fee for a nonsufficient funds check (NSF) from \$20.00 to \$30.00. Customers will be required to pay the NSF check by cash, money order or credit/debit card, with the \$30.00 fee included, Payment of NSF charges must be made in person only- no phone calls.

Fats, Oils, and Grease - Here comes Holiday Cooking!

Improper disposal of fats, oils and grease rendered from holiday cooking is a common mistake. Turkey frying, ham roasting, whatever your main course - please collect and dispose of these drain-clogging substances properly. Cooking oils and grease should never be disposed of down the drain or garbage disposal. Fats, oils and grease may congeal, block pipes and cause a sewer backup. Not a pleasant experience during the hustle and bustle of the Holiday Season. Additionally, dumping these types of substances into the yard is not a solution. November and December can be very rainy months in Portland. The oil residue may run off into the storm drains and into the bay without being properly treated.

Safe Disposal of Leftover Cooking Oils

- * Use an empty, heat safe container to transfer the cooled cooking into; cover, freeze, and throw out with the trash.
- * You can also mix cooking oils with unscented kitty litter or another absorbent and dispose of in the trash. *Do not use scented or disinfectant types as there may be a flammable reaction.*
- * If you have gallons of turkey-frying oils you can also store oil for later use. Oil can be kept for up to six months and reused for up to six hours of fry time. Strain the oil first, and then store in the freezer.
- * Food scraps, shortening, butter, batter, icing, sauces any type of fatty substance should be disposed of in the trash, not in your sink.
